Exam Paper Pattern for UG:

- Total Marks are decided 200 by organization
- 200 multiple choice question are set up in exam.

In the event of equal marks scored by two or more candidates in the **CLAT 2015**, the tie will be broken by the following procedure and order:

- Higher marks in the section of Legal aptitude.
- Higher age
- Computerized draw of lots.
