After paying such high duties on components, once a machine is made; it is subject to excise duty from 5% - 10%. 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

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



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Therefore, we choose to say that the deficiency is *endemic* (commonly found) in the mountains; however, it is no longer *prevalent* (common) in the lowlands. (*sporadic* = *not* continuous; *eradicated* = *wiped out*)

Therefore, we choose *idiosyncrasies*, which are 'quirks', 'oddities' or 'things peculiar to one person'.(stereotypes = generalized views)

- 39.(C) Correct spelling is "Chauvinism". It means "Fanatical patriotism".
- **40.(C)** Correct spelling is "Maladroit" It means "Not adroit". Adroit means "Quick or skilful or adept in action or thought" Maladroit is the antonym of adroit.
- **41. (B)** Signature bridge project is being constructed across river Yamuna. The bridge to be constructed as a replica of the famous London bridge, will have bow-shaped pylon with cable.
- **42. (A)** INS Kamorta is the India's indigenously built anti-submarine corvette as well as the first indigenous stealth corvette built by India.
- 43. (C) India is building the world's highest railway bridge which is expected to be 35 metres taller than the Eiffel Tower when completed by 2016. The arch-shaped steel structure is being constructed over the Chenab river to link sections of the spectacular mountain in Kashmir region.

Tokyo topped UN's ranking of the most populous cities in 2014 with 38 million inhabitants and while its population is projected to decline, it will remain the world's largest city in 2030 with 37 million people. Delhi has become the world's second most populous city in 2014 after Tokyo, more than doubling its population since 1990 to 25 million. Tokyo and New Delhi were followed by Shanghai with 23 million, and Mexico City, Mumbai and Sao Paulo, each with around 21 million inhabitants in 2014.
- **49. (A)** July 11th marks World Population Day, to raise awareness of global population issues. Established by the Governing Council of the United Nations Development Programme in 1989, it was inspired by the interest in Five Billion Day on 11 July 1987 approximately the

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date when the world's population reached five billion. This year, the theme is "Investing in Young People."

Started in 1993, the first award was given to Oriya poet Radhamohan Gadnayak.
- **51. (A)** Carrefour is a French multinational retailer headquartered in Boulogne Billancourt, France. Carrefour announced its intention to close its five cash-and-carry stores in India, where Carrefour has operated since 2010
- **52. (A)** Israel and Hamas Operation Protective Edge is an Israel Defence Forces operation in the Hamas-governed Gaza strip, officially launched on July 8, 2014.
- 53. (A) The Doha Round is the latest round of trade negotiations among the WTO membership. Its aim is to achieve major reform of the international trading system through the introduction of lower trade barriers and revised trade rules. The work programme covers about 20 areas of trade. The Round is also known semi-officially as the **Doha Development Agenda** as a fundamental objective is to improve the trading prospects of developing countries.
- **54. (B)** With a towering height of 70 feet, the world's tallest statute of Mahatma Gandhi was unveiled in Bihar, Patna. 'Bapu' is seen standing affectionately with two children on either side in the bronze statue constructed at the historic Gandhi Maidan here.
